APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion by Alder Busse, seconded by Alder Wood to approve the Minutes of the December 5, 2017 Finance & Personnel Committee meeting, was carried.

NEW BUSINESS

- A. **Consideration of Resolution 17-1-2137 Purchase Approval of One Current Model Year One-Ton Single Rear Wheel Chassis Cab.** Stephany obtained pricing from two local dealers and the WI DOA cooperative purchasing group. Public Works committee recommends the bid from Ewald Automotive Group for \$29,755. It will be upfit with a utility box (@13,500). Kayser did not submit a bid. This will replace 2005 utility pickup truck, the main duty of which is to pull trailers. Balance of about \$3000 remains. *Alder Wood made a motion to approve the resolution; Seconded by Alder Busse. Motion carried.*
- B. **Convene in Closed Session under Wisconsin Statute section 19.85(1)(e) - International Association of Firefighters Local 311 contract negotiations.** *Alder Wood made a motion to go into closed session; Seconded by Alder Busse. Motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.*



On 10-16-16 at 9:27 a.m. I was dispatched to the area of US 12 and Monona Dr. for a disabled vehicle in traffic. Upon arrival I checked the area and located an unoccupied green Subaru Legacy stopped in the outside lane of traffic on north bound Monona Dr. just prior to the entrance to Pier 37. The vehicle was completely blocking the traffic lane and was a safety hazard. I requested dispatch contact PDQ and check if the owner was there. Dispatch did this and advised the owner was not there. I requested Schmidt's Towing respond to tow the vehicle. Schmidt's arrived on scene and towed the vehicle to their lot.

INCIDENT SUPPLEMENT - INVESTIGATION

On 11-10-16 MOPD Det. Sgt. Ryan Losby advised me he received a call from Madison Police Department Sgt. Sweeney. Sgt. Losby told me that Sgt. Sweeney advised him they took a report of a stolen car on 10-11-16 from Lou. Sgt. Losby told me that Sgt. Sweeney advised him recently Lou received a letter from Schmidt's Towing informing him that his car was at their storage facility. Losby told me he checked our records and saw that on 10-16-16 I had requested Schmidt's tow the car because it was unoccupied and disabled in traffic. I advised Sgt. Losby when I ran the registration plate through DOT files I did not receive a notification it was stolen, that I attempted to find a phone number for the registered owner but was unable to, and I had requested dispatch call PDQ to check if the owner or driver was inside. Sgt. Losby told me Sgt. Sweeney advised him the letter stated Lou owed \$1,600 to Schmidt's for fees and Lou wanted us to call Schmidt's and see what could be done about the fees.

On 11-11-16 I called and spoke to John Schmidt, the owner of Schmidt's Towing. John said the current bill on the car is \$1275. John said he would be willing to eliminate the storage fees and only charge the owner for the towing, wrapping of the windows (there were no keys in the car and the windows were down), and a processing fee. John said the new total would be \$205.73.

On 11-11-16 Lou came to the MOPD. I advised Lou of the aforementioned information. Lou said his car was stolen from the lot of Speedway on Verona Rd. Lou said he had left the car running and unattended in the lot while he went into the store. Lou said he spoke with MAPD Sgt. Sweeney and he advised him the suspect that stole the car was in custody now. I advised Lou to contact MAPD Sgt. Sweeney and inform him that you are requesting restitution for the Schmidt's Towing fees. I advised Lou that hopefully if the court ordered restitution he would be reimbursed for the fees. Lou thanked me for my time.

**RENEWAL AND EXTENSION OF INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR
AGREEMENT**

Vandewalle & Associates, Inc.

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into effective as of January 1, 2017, by and between the City of Monona, a Wisconsin municipality (hereinafter the "City"), and Vandewalle & Associates, Inc., a Wisconsin corporation (hereinafter the "Contractor").

WHEREAS, effective March 7, 2016, the City and Contractor entered into an independent contractor agreement for professional planning services to the City for the development of the Waterfront Redevelopment Area (hereinafter the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the term of the Agreement expired on December 31, 2016, but the parties desire to extend it through March 31, 2017, under the terms stated below.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby mutually acknowledged, the parties hereby agree to renew and extend the Agreement effective January 1, 2017, through March 31, 2017. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain as stated therein, except that the total compensation the Contractor shall receive for work performed pursuant to this Renewal and Extension Agreement shall not exceed \$22,000.

Employee Years of Service Recognition

As of 2015 employees were no longer recognized by the Distinguished Service Award – it is now awarded to volunteers only. A policy recognizing employees at the Appreciation Reception beginning at 10 years of service with 5-year increments thereafter was to be put into place in 2016. With staff changes, that did not occur.

Research:

- Most communities recognize service in 5-year increments
- Many communities provide monetary (cash) gifts at increasing increments
