**JANUARY 2017**

## **OPERATIONS DIVISION**

In January of 2017, the Operations Division handled 44 vehicle crashes, down from the 59 crashes last month. Vehicle crashes are a significant part of a Police Officer's day. For traffic enforcement, there were 251 traffic warnings, 214 traffic citations, and 44 parking tickets issued. Our calls total for January was 1,552 calls for service.

### **Training**

Community Resource Officer James Reiter attended a 7-hour CVMIC Peer Support training.

School Resource Officer Luke Wunsch attended a two-day ALICE Instructor Certification training.

Detective Matt Bomkamp attended an 8-hour De-Escalation training.

13 Officers attended the January In-Service training which included the State Firearms Qualification, DAAT and De-Escalation topics.

### **Speed Trailer**

### **Security Checks**

Officers performed 374 security checks in the month of January. A security check is when an Officer goes into a business and walks around to meet with staff to discuss any problems that the businesses are aware of. This also serves as a deterrent for theft. For the overnight shift, this entails checking the perimeter of the business and pulling on doors to make sure the businesses are secure.

### **Retail Thefts**

There were 32 retail theft cases in January, down from the 45 cases in December. Around 50 cases are typical in a month. These cases can be time consuming if the suspect flees and follow-up outside the City is necessary.

### **Tellurian Treatment Center**

In January we had 5 calls to the Tellurian property totaling 6 hours of police time.

## **Use of Force Incidents**

On January 6<sup>th</sup> at 11:58pm an Officer made a traffic stop on Monona Drive for a vehicle speeding 46 MPH in a 30 MPH zone. The driver smelled of intoxicants and was put through field sobriety tests. Upon completion of the tests the officer went to arrest the driver who then became non-compliant and struggled with the arresting officer and backup officer. The driver was directed over to the squad and attempted to pull away from the officers while screaming. Two knee strikes were delivered to the back of the drivers legs to attempt to gain control, along with the threat of being tasered. The driver then complied with being handcuffed. The driver was arrested for resisting arrest and issued citations for OWI and Speeding.

On January 16<sup>th</sup> at 2:56am an Officer attempted to make a traffic stop on the Beltline for speeding, 84 MPH in a 55 MPH zone. The plate came back to a stolen vehicle out of Madison. The vehicle exited the off ramp to US HWY 51. At the end of the ramp the vehicle rapidly accelerated back on to the Beltline and quickly reached speeds of over 100 MPH. Our Officer terminated the pursuit according to policy but aired the information to the County. A short time later, a Dane County Deputy located the vehicle on HWY N and the driver again attempted to flee, but crashed a few minutes later. The driver and two occupants were arrested by County Deputies, with the assistance of a Town of Madison K9. Charges are pending.

On January 19<sup>th</sup> at 12:41pm an Officer was dispatched to an apartment to take a report of a known mentally ill neighbor trying to enter the caller's apartment door several times thinking this was his apartment. As the officer was taking the report the male walked in past the officer. The male refused to listen to the officers verbal commands and had to be deescalated to try to secure him in handcuffs. Backup was called and it took three officers to control him enough to be handcuffed. The subject was taken to a hospital for a mental health assessment and then taken to jail. Due to his condition, criminal charges were dropped the next week and he was transported to Winnebago mental health for additional treatment.

## **1<sup>st</sup> Shift Monthly Report**

On January 18<sup>th</sup> at 12:39 pm a man went to the Meriter Clinic with a gun shot wound to his leg. The male claimed he was field stripping his handgun in his work truck and accidentally failed to remove the chambered round first and the gun went off. This male was in the passenger seat and the driver's story was the same. The driver then brought the victim to the nearest clinic. The Officer looked in the work truck and the evidence was consistent with the story. However the Officer did learn that this incident happened in the City of Madison on Pflaum Road and this case was then handed over to the Madison Police Department for further investigation.

On January 20<sup>th</sup> at approximately 10:10 am, Monona officers were dispatched to the Monona Wal-Mart, 2151 Royal Avenue, for a report of an armed robbery of a 68 year old female in the parking lot. The suspect displayed a handgun and pulled the purse off the victims shoulder and fled. The victim obtained a partial license plate of the suspect's car and gave a description of the male suspect. Another witness identified the vehicle as a white Pontiac Grand Prix, and noted the direction of travel on the beltline. The suspect and vehicle description were aired to the Dane County Communications Center and a short time later an observant Dane County Deputy spotted the vehicle on HWY 151 in Sun Prairie. The vehicle was subsequently stopped by Deputies, and the male confessed to a Monona Detective about committing the robbery. A BB gun and the victim's purse containing \$1 in cash, was located inside the vehicle. The suspect was arrested and taken to jail for armed robbery.

### 2nd Shift

Officers on second shift conducted 154 traffic stops, handled 16 Retail Thefts, 19 crashes, and arrested 4 Drunk Drivers. We also made several warrant arrests as a result of traffic stops. In one case both the driver and passenger had active arrest warrants.

On January 17<sup>th</sup>, second shift officers took reports of thefts from vehicles in the 5600-5700 blocks of Tonyawatha. Some of the victims reported that their vehicles were unlocked. In one case the victim's vehicle was removed from the garage, but was found on the street a few doors down the next morning. The key's had been left in the vehicle.

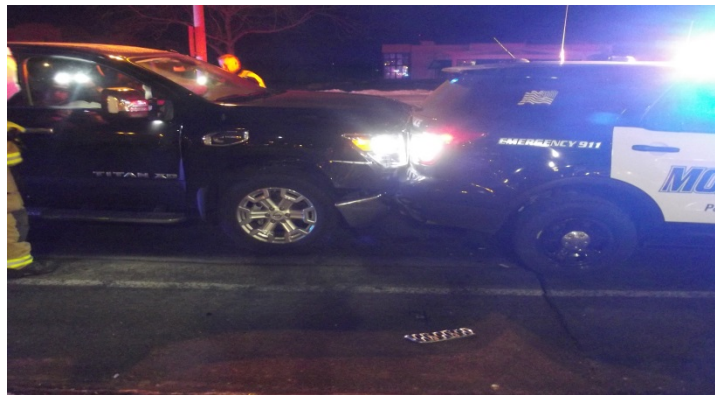
Please remember to lock your vehicles, even when they are in your locked garage and remove the keys.

### **3rd Shift**

The Monona Police Department third shift officers handled 3 vehicle crashes, 2 retail thefts, and responded to several disturbance calls during the month of January. Officers made 122 traffic stops resulting in 10 OWI arrest. Officers also arrested 2 individuals on arrest warrants.

On January 1<sup>st</sup> at 12:38 am, a traffic stop was conducted on Broadway Avenue near the Pier 37 entrance. While on the traffic stop a pickup truck hauling a trailer rear ended the officer's squad car causing severe damage. The operator of the pickup truck was arrested for OWI by the Dane Co Sheriff's Dept. The sheriff's dept. was called over to handle the crash investigation. Luckily the officer was not in his car at the time and there were no injuries.



On January 6<sup>th</sup> at 12:47 a.m. a traffic stop was conducted for a speed violation on Monona Drive. The operator of the vehicle was arrested for OWI 1<sup>st</sup> and possession of 31.3 grams of marijuana.

On January 13<sup>th</sup> at 1:01a.m. a traffic stop was conducted for a speed violation 96 mph in a 55 mph zone on Stoughton Rd. The operator was arrested for 1<sup>st</sup> offense OWI with a B.A.C. of .17g/210L.

On January 29<sup>th</sup> at 1:15 a.m. a vehicle was stopped for speeding and poor driving behavior. The operator was arrested for 3<sup>rd</sup> offense OWI with blood results pending from the WI State Laboratory of Hygiene.

## **Community Resource Officer**

During the month of January, Community Resource Officer Reiter was involved in the following crime prevention and community relations activities:

Met with Dane County Sheriff and Madison Officers reference their procedures of helping domestic victims. With their support and helping hand we will be creating a follow up procedure with domestic violence victims. To better our response to victims in Domestic Violence and have better contacts I started attending regular meets at DAiS with the DVCCR each month.

Attended the Dane County area Mental Health meeting with Lt. Wiegel. A panel of people from all around the Madison area was present to talk about how to end homelessness and improve relationships with area police departments.

Continued with the lunch with a cop program at Winnequah School. One particular lunch was set up with a student who had been a victim of a crime in Monona.

Madison Police Department advised they had scheduled active shooter training with Veridian Homes, thinking the business was in Madison. They requested my help with the training. This training took place on two separate days for 4 hours each training day. Employees were able to get hands on training with scenarios and classroom lecture.

Conducted two safety talks with the Frostwoods Apartments about general safety around their building and personal security.

Had a Monona Neighborhood Watch Meeting to reengage the watch group, talk about the year prior with Monona Police, and ways to help keep their community safe.

Attended a CVMIC training session on how to develop a peer support group within your organization, what tools you may need, and who to contact. This is something I will be working on in the future to get things started.

Assisted with covering a few road shifts for vacations and time off.

### Current Investigations

#### **MO17-00386 – ARMED ROBBERY**

Detectives responded with patrol to an armed robbery with a gun in the parking lot of a local store. Information was quickly obtained suspect information was broadcast county-wide. A deputy spotted the vehicle and stopped it in Dodge County. Monona Detectives responded to that location and took custody of the suspect and his vehicle. A search of the car recovered the gun and the victim's stolen purse.

#### **MO16-04668 – SEXUAL ASSAULT**

A woman reported being sexually assaulted by a known male. Detectives continue to work on this case as a jury trial approaches.

#### **MO17-00621 – ARMED ROBBERY**

A man reported being robbed of his wallet at knife-point in the parking lot of a local restaurant. Detectives obtained video of the parking lot showing the victim not being robbed. The case was closed.

#### **MO17-00495 - BURGLARY**

On January 25<sup>th</sup>, an office building in the 5900 block of Monona Drive was burglarized. The suspect was spotted by an employee in the building, who confronted them and took their picture with a cell phone. While this is not recommended, having the photo allowed the suspect to be positively identified. After conducting a search warrant, the subject was



arrested and made a full confession. Charges have been referred to the Dane County District Attorney's Office.

### **School Resource Officer**

January was a slow month relative to the rest of the school year so far. I handled 6 cases at the Monona Grove High School, 1 case at Glacial Drumlin Middle School, and 0 cases at Winnequah Elementary School. I issued 2 Disorderly Conduct citations, 1 Battery citation, and 9 Parking citations.

I attended 2 days of A.L.I.C.E. training at UW La Crosse. A.L.I.C.E. training is designed to teach schools and businesses how to respond to an active threat inside their building. Implementation and training of staff in the A.L.I.C.E. model will be moving forward in the Monona School District during the remainder of the school year.

I gave 2 presentations to sixth grade health classes at Glacial Drumlin Middle School about how to be safe in the community.

There was a physical fight between two male students at Glacial Drumlin Middle School. One student slammed the other student to the ground before punching and kicking him in the head. The fight was broken up by school staff. One student was issued citations for Disorderly Conduct and Battery.

There was a shoving match that took place in gym class at the Monona Grove High School. I counseled both students and the school disciplined them.

A student at MG21 (alternative high school) accused another student of dealing marijuana. Several students were interviewed and no evidence was found to support the accusations.

A handful of students at the Monona Grove High School were counseled about their activity on social media. The amount of social media communication throughout the day continues to be a problem in all schools.

A former student returned to the Monona Grove High School campus after school and began yelling at a current student. The former student was confronted by administration

and myself and told to leave. The former student remained vocal and disrespectful, but left school grounds. The former student was told she would be arrested for trespassing if she returned to school grounds without prior permission.

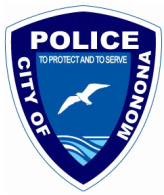
Each of the adult and juvenile arrests and referrals take at least an hour and a half of the dispatchers' time to complete the reports and intake paperwork for the Dane County District Attorney's Office. In addition, Police staff must follow up by going to the DA's office to sign complaints or probable cause forms to ensure the subjects are properly charged or held on charges.

### **Dispatch**

The Monona Communications Center answers 911 and business line calls for Police, Fire, and EMS incidents. Calls for service for Fire and EMS are transferred to the Dane County Communications Center and a pre-alert is sent by the Monona Communications Center to Monona Fire and EMS personnel. The Monona Communications Center dispatches Police to all emergency and non-emergency calls, tracking the calls for service and officer response times. Many of the business line calls include routine phone calls from citizens who are not only seeking police assistance, but also assistance with processing citation payments, requesting police records and general assistance issues. The dispatchers are also responsible for preparing and filing officer reports, citations, accidents, parking, UCR reporting and many other routine daily duties.

During the month of January, Dispatchers handled 1,552 calls for service. These calls were derived from 120 calls which came in on the 911 lines with the remaining calls coming in on the non-emergency lines or directly from Monona Officers.

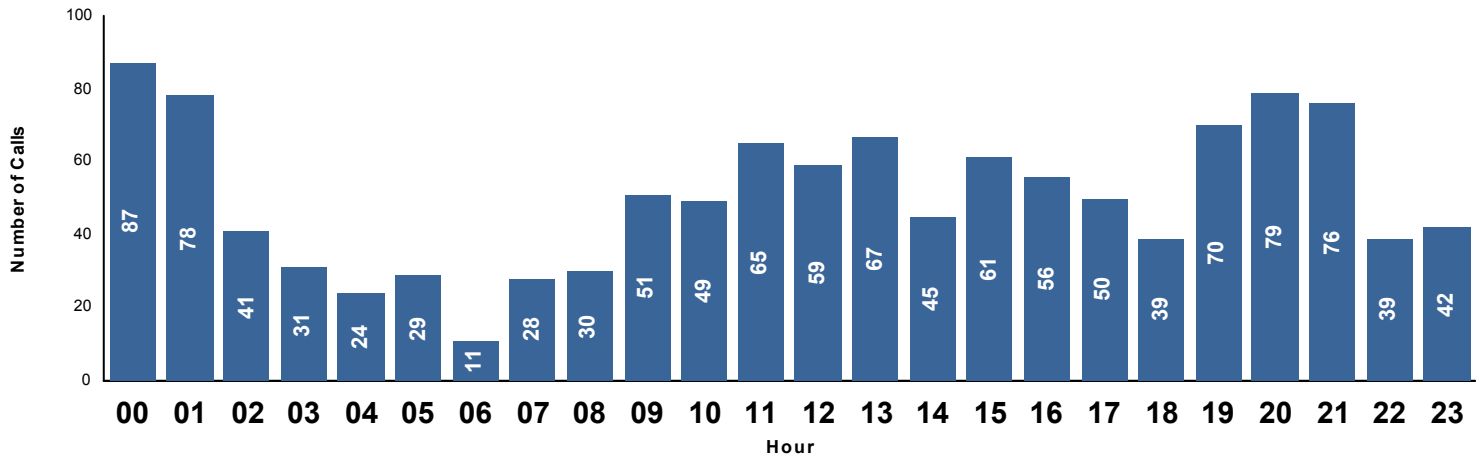

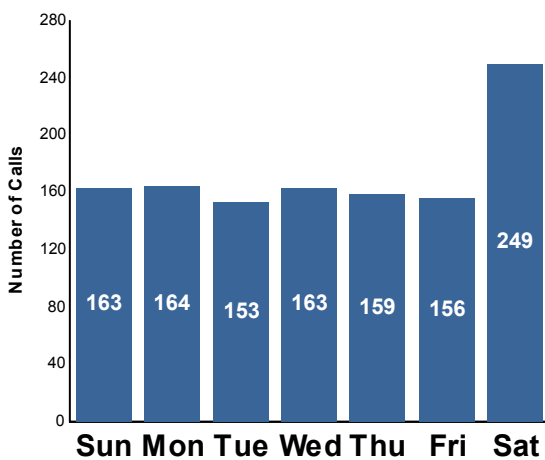

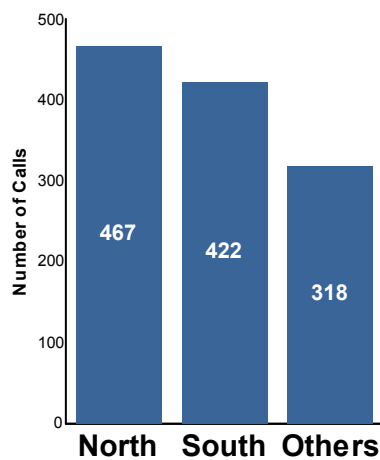
### Calls by Time of Day



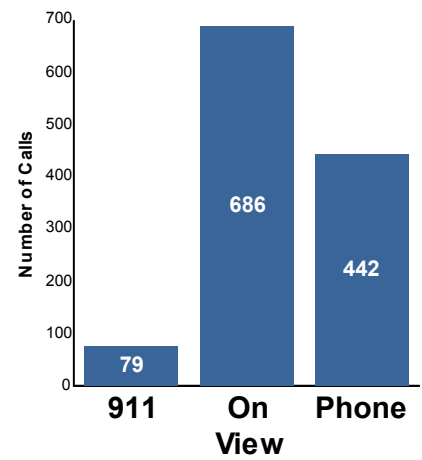
### Calls by Day of Week

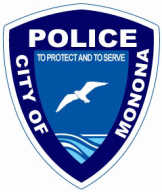


### Calls by Sector
